


Master of Leadership Development & Management

PRINCIPLES OF RESPONSIBLE MANAGEMENT EDUCATION

Bangabandhu Institute at Newport University CED was the first global non-political research institute for public interests on Bangladesh and the Father of Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and Leadership Development Studies with PRME principles as the first institution of its type started operation in 2014 at Dhaka city in Bangladesh. The Newport University CED, Latvia became a member in 2010 and sign the principles of responsible management education - PRME. The Principles for Responsible Management Education (PRME) initiative is the first organized relationship between the United Nations (UN) and business schools. The mission of PRME is to inspire and champion responsible management education, research and thought leadership globally.

The six PRME principles are:

Principle 1 | Purpose: We will develop the capabilities of students to be future generators of sustainable value for business and society at large and to work for an inclusive and sustainable global economy.

Principle 2 | Values: We will incorporate into our academic activities and curricula the values of global social responsibility as portrayed in international initiatives such as the United Nations Global Compact.

Principle 3 | Method: We will create educational frameworks, materials, processes and environments that enable effective learning experiences for responsible leadership.

Principle 4 | Research: We will engage in conceptual and empirical research that advances our understanding about the role, dynamics, and impact of corporations in the creation of sustainable social, environmental and economic value.

Principle 5 | Partnership: We will interact with managers of business corporations to extend our knowledge of their challenges in meeting social and environmental responsibilities and to explore jointly effective approaches to meeting these challenges.

Principle 6 | Dialogue: We will facilitate and support dialog and debate among educators, students, business, government, consumers, media, civil society organizations and other interested groups and stakeholders on critical issues related to global social responsibility and sustainability.
